Mentor Eligibility:

Retired Michigan Engineering Faculty

Student Eligibility:

CEDO will match retired faculty members with:

- current engineering first, second, or third year students who have experienced some difficulty adjusting to college life and have requested a faculty mentor.
- current first or second year LSA students in the Comprehensive Studies Program (CSP) who are aspiring to transfer to engineering

Time commitment:

Minimum of hour a month during the fall and winter semesters.

Modes of Mentoring

- Mentor students in-person or virtually
- Offering non-technical expertise and guidance to students (non-academic)
- Providing feedback on student academic, personal, and professional goals and improvement plans
- Conducting mock job interviews
- Providing helpful feedback on resumés
